

DONATION ENLARGEMENT OF EVANSVILLE

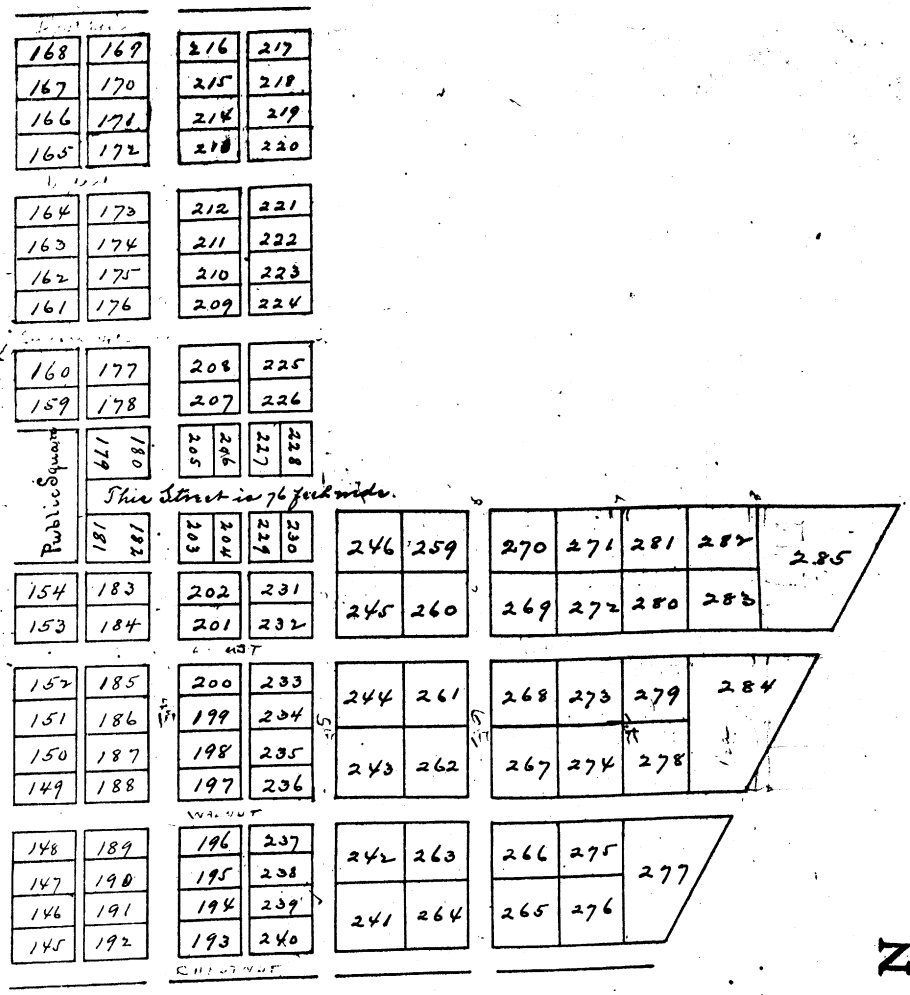
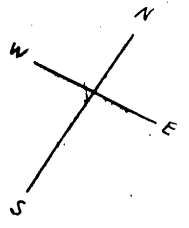
This Enlargement of Evansville is laid out agreeably to the original plan of Evansville one half of the public square being located on this plan, lots beginning at 145 and extending to 217 in arithmetical progression are the lots given by the undersigned proprietors to the use of Vanderburgh County. Together with the whole of the public square located on this Enlargement. And on the original plan of said town, as a donation for the use of said County. Out lots beginning at No 241 and extending to 285 in arithmetical progression contain about one half acre and four poles each, except lots 277, 284 & 285 which are fractional lots. Lot No 277 contains about one acre. Lot No 284 contain about one and one half acres. Lot No 285 contains about two acres and are termed out lots are the private property of Erass and Jones, two of the Proprietors. Main Street is 76 feet wide, all other streets are 60 feet wide the alleys are twelve feet wide, the streets are given to the Public to be kept open as public highways, the alleys are given to the Public to be kept open as private highways, for the convenience of the Public. In what is called the Public Square there is four square or blocks given to the use of Vanderburgh County under the direction of the County Commissioners to erect thereon such Public Buildings as they may deem expedient and necessary. the streets passing through said square are public highways in common with the other streets in said town.
